Thank you to all of you that were able to donate supplies to start the year. It makes starting the year stress free and know I truly appreciate all of your support.

Curriculum Update

<u>Math</u>: This week in math, we reviewed multiplication and division with whole numbers. Students learned a variety of strategies to assist them in demonstrating their understanding. Students practiced this skill with a game of Trashketball on Wednesday. We also learned how to use short hand drawings to conceptualize the decomposing/exchanging of values in order for a 3 to 4 digit dividend to be divided by a 2 digit divisor. This strategy will not be required of the students, but it is a great way to "see" what is happening when a student divides whole numbers.

Reading: In reading this week, we learned how an author uses the thoughts, speech, actions and interactions with other characters to help the reader create inferences. Students learned what it means to quote accurately to support their inferences as well. We also discussed the difference between feelings and traits. While this seems easy, it is a more challenging concept to apply when analyzing the characters in a text. On Tuesday, our mini lesson focused on interpreting figurative language. Students enjoyed the Nearpod activity that was used to practice this concept. In writing, we are continuing to refine our foundational skills in order to prepare for our first narrative writing piece.

Social Studies: We've continued our economics unit this week. Our focus on understand a personal budget as well as how taxes are used to help fund the common defense and general welfare of the people. Students were given an assignment to budget \$1,000 for their local community. The students seemed to enjoy this activity. Be sure to ask them all about it. At the end of the week, they learned about specialization and division of labor with a fun bookmark making activity.
